Kiss and Drop

The drop-off area provides parents and carers with a safe environment to drop off their children by car. This area is on the school side of the road in Meryula Street, provides convenience for drivers and will enhance childrens' safety. Parents and carers are able to legally drop off their children within a two-minute timeframe. You may get out of the car to

assist your child as long as you stay within three meters of the vehicle. The Drop-off zone will allow:

- Drivers to drop off students legally at the beginning of the school day
- A Drop-off zone has advantages for child road safety because it:

• Provides a designated zone at a school access point for drivers to stop and drop off their children

- Relieves traffic congestion around the school
- Allows smaller children to remain secured in the car while school age children are

dropped off

• Reinforces road safety messages and safe passenger behaviours to parents and children

Safety tips for drivers using a 'drop-off area:

- Drop-off your child at the designated area
- Make sure children use the footpath-side door when getting out of the vehicle
- Never double park
- Never undertake a U-turn in school zones

Safety tips for students:

- Stay buckled up until the vehicle has stopped in the 'drop-off' area
- Make sure your school bag and other items are in a safe position, eg on the floor.
- Be ready to get out of the car with your belongings when the car has stopped and you have unbuckled your seatbelt.

• Always get out of the backseat of the vehicle through the safety door – the rear footpath-side door.

The Narromine Police have informed the school that they will be having a strong presence in the area around the grounds at drop off and pick up times.


